Tarek has served as Chairman of the Board for the American School of Doha, and for Colorado Youth at Risk, and for twenty years helped Co-Chair the Hate Crimes Education Task Force of the Colorado Lawyers Committee presenting mock trials to students and community organizations.

Accolades

- Winning a lengthy, hotly contested, complex securities fraud case for a Middle East investor after trial in the United States that resulted in a US\$1million settlement from the aiders and abettors, and a judgment in excess of US\$23 million against the primary fraudster.
